#### **List Annotations**

The **Abundance** (C/U/R) annotations give an indication of how easy or difficult it might be to find a species. They indicate the likelihood that an experienced birder might record the species, during a day bird-watching, at the right time of year, in the appropriate habitat., within the area described in this list.

The Seasonal Status annotations give a guide as how much time a species might spend in this area. Thus Resident species are believed to occur at least somewhere within the area all year round. Seasonal Visitors include migrants from within Australia, wandering nomadic species which move to the area when local conditions are suitable and also waterbirds such as ducks and egrets which may move out of the area to breed when conditions inland are suitable.

## **INFORMATION**

The *Atherton Tableland* covers the area from Mareeba in the north, south to Herberton and Ravenshoe, east to Millaa Millaa and the Coastal Range. It includes the districts around Atherton, Malanda and Yungaburra and Lakes Tinaroo, Eacham and Barrine. For the purposes of this list, areas around Kuranda and Julatten are not included

Habitats include rainforest, dry woodlands, wet and dry sclerophyll forest, swamps and open water. Large areas (mainly rainforest) are protected in the Wet Tropics World Heritage Area. The diverse habitat attracts a large range of bird species within a relatively small area and offers great birdwatching opportunities, with over 300 species including all Wet Tropic endemics, Blue-faced Parrot-Finch and Sarus Crane (winter/Dry season).

National Parks/ reserves: Mt. Hypipamee ('The Crater'), Longlands Gap, Wongabel, Hasties Swamp, Halloran's Hill, Davies Creek, Danbulla, Crater Lakes (Barrine & Eacham), Malanda Falls, Curtain Fig

Areas of interest: Lake Tinaroo, Bromfield Swamp, Nardello's Lagoon, Kaban, Mareeba Wetlands, Tolga Scrub, Pelican Point
